China has made great strides in its Central Asian diplomacy over the past 30 years since the establishment of diplomatic relations with the regional countries, with three pillars including the SCO, the SREB, and the "C+C5" cooperation mechanism. While leading to significant changes in the regional landscape, challenges remain that restrict the outcomes and prospects of the engagement. A “soft” strategy is expected to make up for the deficiencies in “hard” input, and India’s strategic position will grow as it looms as the focal point for partnerships with European powers in the region.
