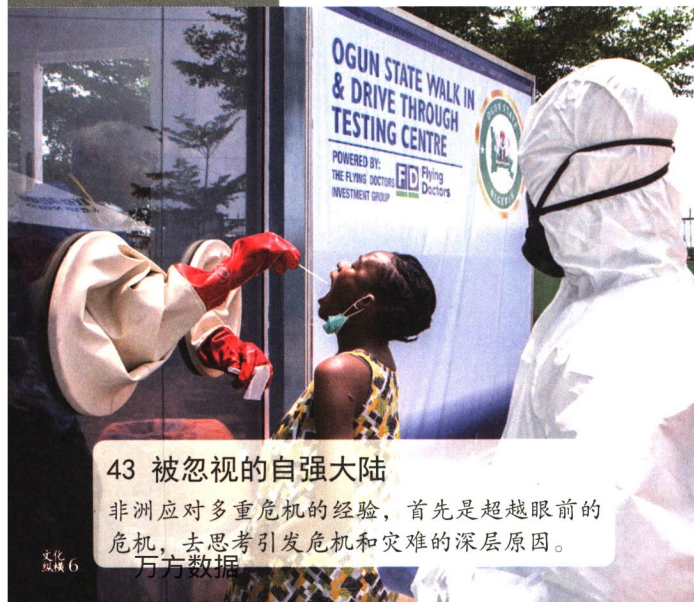

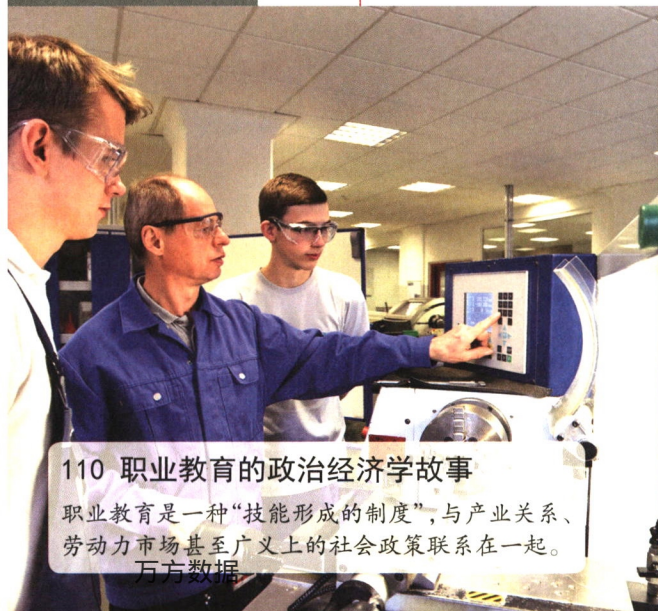

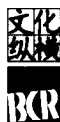

- China's passive involvement in the west-dominant world system in the 19th Century is the core variable influencing China's political, social, economic, and diplomatic relations with the rest of the world. The incompatibility between the "Tianxia System" and "Cosmopolitanism" remains unresolved with China's rise. The Russia-Ukraine Crisis might provide an excuse for the West to reshape its relations with China. China-Africa solidarity forged from "revolutionary brotherhood" in history to "development partnership" since the new millennium has laid a good foundation for China to cultivate an alternative cosmopolitanism, although more efforts are needed to counter-balance the influences of Africa-West long-term (neo) colonial relationship.*

- Although the general environment for the industry is harsh in Africa, Chinese enterprises can make modest progress by utilizing the strength and experiences of China's powerful industrial system. The synergetic development of industrial zones and infrastructure facilities provides critical support for the burgeoning factories. Chinese investors also increasingly focus on building connections with local clients, suppliers, and communities. The diverging values between Chinese and Africans are still the most fundamental challenges for bilateral cooperation. However, shared history of seeking independence, mutual respect in politics, and flexible and extensive practice help diverse stakeholders to achieve the common target of win-win industrial development.*

- The decision of the US Supreme Court in Dobbs, which overruled Roe and denied the constitutional right to abortion, has brought about a seismic change in both American law and society. The decision and the constitutional interpretation controversy involved marks an unprecedented split among the justices of the Supreme Court and the part sanitation and politicization of the Court. The case results from the increasing intensification of the ideological civil war in the US in the past decades, and it serves as a symbol of, as well as a catalyst for, the coming civil war similar to the Civil War, though not fought by regular armies.*

Tracing its roots to the second industrial revolution, the author examined the historical contingencies which underpinned the success and failure of VET development. The embeddedness of human labor and skills into economic production has been contested by other factors, among which rationalization of production and individual social mobility are two significant ones. Therefore, the establishment of VET could not be equated to an equilibrium state. Rather, the institution is always on the brink of change and requires constant recalibration against disorganizing forces.</i>	Zhou Yisu

At the same time, there are still unsolved problems in the data factor market, such as effectiveness, fairness, and redistribution.
