The Irish border issue has reemerged in the context of Brexit, and any solution will affect not only the UK's national unity, but also the Northern Ireland peace process and UK-EU economic and trade relations. Trapping Brexit into the "Britain-drag", the Irish border issue has become Brexit's bottleneck. The UK and the EU are not on the same track when it comes to interest defining and policy selection in the tangled mentalities of Brexit. The Brexit dilemma, when combined with the Irish border issue, has cast a spotlight on the West's political and social fragmentation, as well as the dysfunction of its parliamentary democracy.

UK and FPDA in the Horizon of "Global Britain"

As a strategic pivot for defense partnerships, the Five Power Defense Arrangements (FPDA) has tremendous implications in the UK for facilitating the UK's strategic extension from the Indian Ocean to the Pacific. By connecting the two regions, FPDA would allow "Global Britain" to combine with the US Indo-Pacific strategy. It can bolster UK intervention in Asia-Pacific security affairs, particularly the South China Sea issue, and contribute to defensive cooperation between the UK and its allies and partners. On the other hand, FPDA could contribute to closer UK-ASEAN ties. FPDA faces challenges in resource investment, "collective action" in the South China Sea, alliance constraints, and disparate maritime security environments between Indian and Pacific. As such, FPDA's future depends on UK determination, investment and strategic operation.

In recent years, relations between Japan and South Korea have become tense, giving rise to economic and trade frictions and plunging the bilateral relationship to an all-time low. The fast deteriorating Japan-ROK relationship has resulted from multiple factors, including mutually enhancing old and new grievances over historical issues, the adjustment of foreign policies, the rise of nationalist emotions, US adjustment of its

alliance policy towards the Asia-Pacific, and structural competition in forming the regional order. As the structural contradictions between Japan and South Korea appear hard to overcome, the potential for the tense relationship to persist is mounting.

What's New in Germany's Cooperation with Africa?

Germany has gradually increased its investment in Africa. In addition to promoting traditional economic and trade cooperation, Germany has paid more attention to security issues in Africa and to improved cooperation in defense, immigration and counter-terrorism. As Germany explores new models of development aid and encourages renewable energy and environmental protection in African countries, German capability and willingness to cooperate with African nations are on the rise. While Germany welcomes the African consumer market, historic problems centering on value differences and the European Union's diplomatic constraints obstruct German-African cooperation over the short term. Germany promotes trilateral cooperation with China and Africa but encounters several challenges within its forward momentum.
